Just like that, it's March and we're inching close to Spring Break! With only a few months left of the 2023-2024 school year, it is critically important to maintain grades. We have a large amount of failures, so we're asking parents to follow up with students to ensure all work is completed. Please continue to work with our teachers to help keep your students on track. We will mark the end of the quarter on March 14th, which will be a regular school day for students. Any semester one and Quarter 3 failures will be addressed and contact will be made with the parent.

Our growth and proficiency data from January were incredibly good and we are so proud of the academic progress our students made from September to January. We want to keep that going, so we are still focused on preparation for the F.A.S.T. tests and End of Course (EOC) exams that students will take in May. In addition to academics, we have students competing in soccer and starting try-outs for track and field. The Lee County Sheriff's Department has been conducting active patrols along the street in front of our school, West Terry St. Please drive cautiously in this area as we have student arrival (9:15a-9:30a) and student dismissal (4:00p-4:15p) each day. The speed limit when the school lights are flashing is 20 MPH. Walkers and bike riders are encouraged to follow safety standards as they travel the sidewalk and street crossings. Thank you for working with them on this. Keep reading to see more about this.

Before your child can begin the 7th grade he/she must have documentation of having received the following immunizations: TDaP booster (Tetanus, Diphtheria, pertussis) after the age of 10.

We encourage all parents to have their child seen by a private physician or health care provider in the community prior to the busy summer season to receive the required immunizations. Private physicians and clinics charge according to their established fees. Vaccines required for children are available free of charge from all Lee Health Department facilities. Remember you must bring your child's immunization records with you to help determine what immunizations are required and to provide the information necessary to fill out the Florida Certificate of Immunization Form DH-680.

Dear BSMCA Parents: In cooperation with the Lee County Sheriff's Department, we are asking for your cooperation in securing the safety of our students. Here are just a few reminders so that we can ensure all students safety arrive and depart our school each day:

Our Dismissal Process starts at 4:00pm and we stagger release in the following manner:

4:00p: First four buses on the bus ramp and ALL of parent pick up students

- 4:05p: All bicycle riders; second group of buses
- 4:07p: 6th grade walkers
- 4:09p: 7th grade walkers; third group of buses, if on campus
- 4:11p: All clubs, athletics, activities and aftercare students
- 4:12p: 8th-grade walkers; remaining bus students to the BSMCA Cafeteria

FOR PARENT PICK UP:

- Parents are asked to keep the West Terry roadway clear at all times so that general traffic still flows. We have four parent pick up lanes so that we can accommodate all parents (lanes 3 & 4 typically have spaces available each day)
- Please be aware of the bicycle path as many residents pass across our entry and exit
- The speed limit on West Terry is 30 MPH
- During morning and afternoon dismissal, all vehicles should be adhering to the 20 MPH limit while in the school zone. We do have lights flashing as a reminder.

FOR BICYCLE RIDERS AND WALKERS:

- We purposefully ask that all bicycle riders exit the campus first and quickly so that walkers are not in their path. Please ask your students to adhere to this.
- Once walkers are dismissed they should leave campus immediately and cross at the designated crosswalks or stay on the main bicycle path. If you have an older child escorting a younger sibling home, this would be the only exception.
- Please encourage your students to follow the directions at the crosswalk and only walk or bike when the signal identifies it is safe to do so. There is limited visibility for drivers coming from Pine Street or at the roundabout and we want to ensure that all students cross those roads safely.
- If bicycles must ride on the street, please be sure that your students know that they should always ride with traffic and not against it/head into it.

FOR BUS RIDERS:

Parents, thank you for sharing your concerns with us about late bus arrivals. I know that you are aware that we often have little control over this, but we are sure that does not alleviate your frustration. Our transportation team is committed to updating you on all changes as we receive them.

- Since riding a public school bus is a privilege, please speak with your students about appropriate behaviors while on the bus.


Spring Aling

Out of 600,000 entries hers shined bright!



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


